HOW CAN I USE TWITTER TO ADVOCATE?

The Endocrine Society encourages its members to contact their Members of Congress or the European Parliament to advocate for endocrine research through increased NIH funding, better physician payment, proposed legislation that affects your research and practice, and a host of other topics.

Many government representatives have Twitter accounts which they use to connect with their constituents and keep them up to date with the latest legislative news. Using Twitter to tweet to your government representatives is an easy and effective way to make your voice heard!

In order to easily navigate our online advocacy system and tweet to your government representatives, please follow the below steps and take action today!

STEP 1:

To Tweet to your government representative using our platform, select an Endocrine Society campaign that provides this option such as the one shown here.

Support \$41.1 Billion for NIH in FY 2020 >>

The Endocrine Society is urging the Senate to provide \$41.1 billion for the National Institutes of Health (NIH) in fiscal year (FY) 2020, an increase of \$2 billion over FY 2019. While there is bipartisan support for NIH, to achieve increased funding the Congress must first reach agreement on raising current statutory spending caps or we will see dramatic cuts in total federal spending starting in FY 2020.




STEP 4:

Upon selecting the “Tweet” button you will be prompted to log into your Twitter account by a pop-up window such as the one seen here.


If you are new to Twitter and do not have an account, you can also sign up for the platform in this window.
